

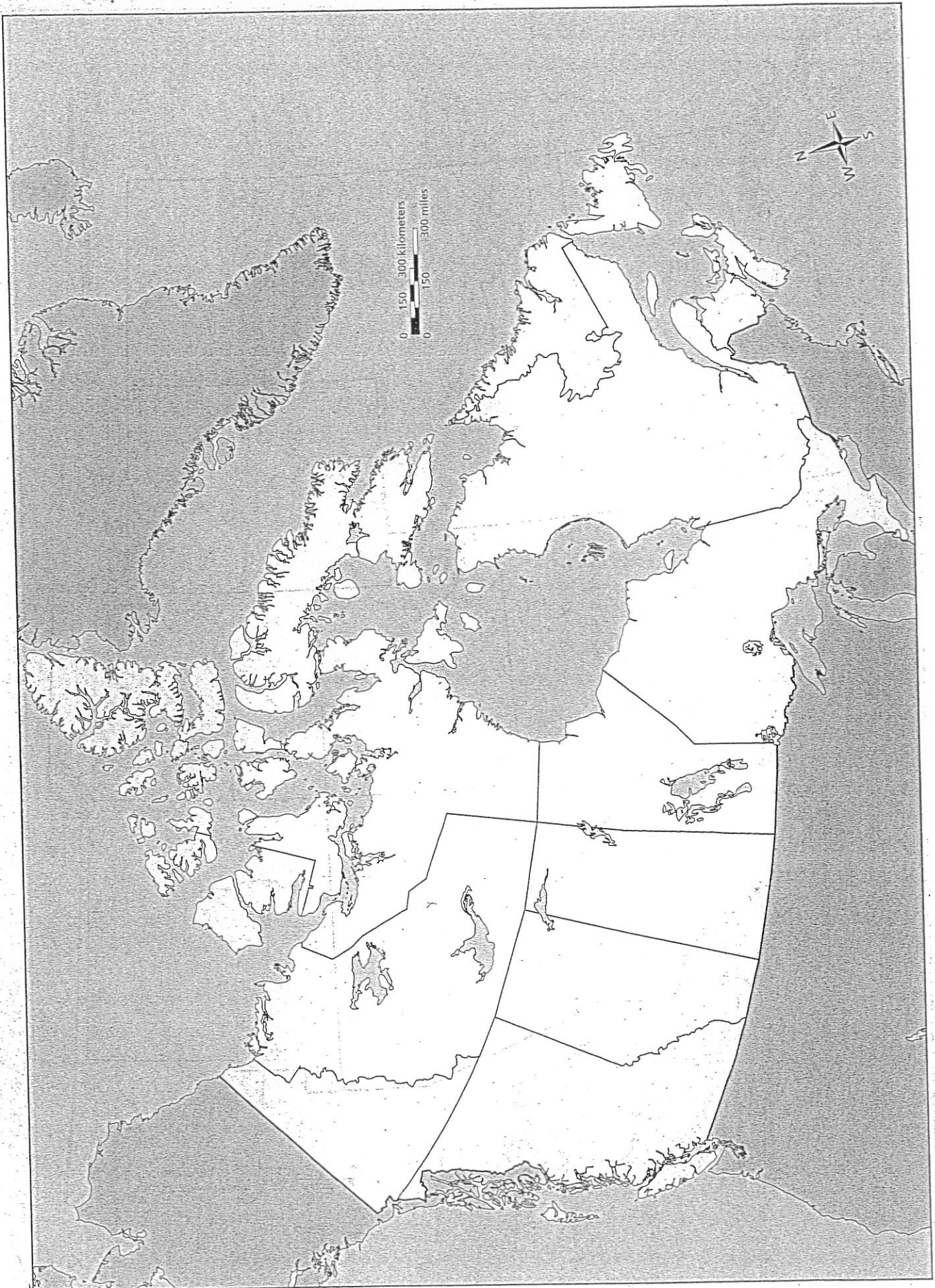
Map Labeling
